RE: Application of Ordinance 10-52 – OPEB Contribution

In June of 2008, the Town Council adopted the following ordinance:

Section 10-52. Retiree Benefit Trust Fund.

- (a) There is established a Retiree Benefit Trust Fund. The purpose of the fund is to provide funds to meet long-term obligations of the Town of East Hartford regarding health benefits provided to retired town employees in accordance with provisions for such benefits contained in any agreement between town employees and the Town of East Hartford.
- (b) Income to such fund shall include any amounts appropriated to such fund by the town council or as provided in this subsection and any return on investments of such funds. If, at the close of any fiscal year, the undesignated reserve fund for the town exceeds eight percent of the total budget appropriation for such fiscal year, the budget surplus in such fiscal year, as verified by the town auditors, shall be appropriated to the Retiree Benefit Trust Fund.
- (c) Expenses of such fund shall include those expenses necessary for the maintenance and administration of the fund, including but not limited to actuary and consulting fees. Fund expenses shall not include compensation of any town employee or other general office-related expenses unless approved by the Town Council.

With respect to the aforementioned ordinance, specifically subsection (b), attached please find a worksheet which calculates the amount of transfer required from Fund Balance to meet the conditions of the ordinance. The transfer of \$1,596,840 will be processed in January and deposited into the OPEB Trust. Please forward this memo to the Town Council as a communication.

As we discussed, the Tax Collector plans to use Tax Serv to enhance collections in three areas where the collection of delinquencies has proved to be very difficult.

The first area is motor vehicle (MV) delinquencies over one year old. The current process in place sees the Tax Office attempt to collect MV delinquencies by demand letter and alias tax warrant via the Constables. The Constables as a matter of practice send a letter out as a cover to the Town issued Alias Tax Warrant. In both collection instances, the taxpayer generally only pays when they need a MV clearance in order to reregister the MV. The addition of TaxServ will allow the Town to more thoroughly attempt to collect the taxes it bills, making the process fairer to those who pay their taxes timely.

The second area is on Personal Property (PP) collections. Annually, many new businesses open and most of those close within a year, so collecting PP is difficult and becomes more difficult with the passage of time. The addition of TaxServ will allow us to create a process whereby we more quickly serve a business, protecting the rights available to the Tax Collector to collect on the tax bills issued.

The last area we expect to use TaxServ is for the collection of "orphan properties" like land locked parcels, strip parcels, parcels where the deed is split between multiple parties, and in situations where a fire or lack of maintenance has rendered a parcel uninhabitable. In short, those parcels where a tax lien sale has not produced a bidder. With TaxServ, we will move more quickly to preserve our position with respect to the collection of a tax bill. TaxServ will take those 4 or so dozen properties that we haven't been able to collect on and recommend a strategy for collection. That recommendation in all likelihood will result in a request for some kind of Town Council action.

As we move toward using Tax Serv, there will likely be the occasional taxpayer who has a long-overdue bill that has grown substantially due to the 18% annual interest application and the taxpayer was unaware they even owed the bill. Please understand this is a situation that occurs frequently now, even before the addition of TaxServ. In these instances, the Tax Collector is bound by State statute which makes the taxpayer liable to the Town on July 1st based on the assessment of October 1 of the prior year even when they did not receive a tax bill because the tax liability is not created by the receipt of a bill. One of the core cases the Tax Collector relies on when formulating policy is Goddard vs. the Town Seymour. In that case, the duty to pay rests with the taxpayer. Further, State statute does not allow a Tax Collector the ability to waive interest so the Tax Collector is duty bound to attempt to

collect all taxes fairly and equitably on behalf of all taxpayers. Also be advised that 98% of all taxes billed are paid timely. Using Tax Serv will allow us to more ably pursue the 2% who do not pay their taxes timely in fairness to the 98% who do.

WHEREAS, in order to acquire such Equipment, the Town proposes to enter into that certain Master Equipment Lease/Purchase Agreement (the "Agreement") with Banc of America Public Capital Corp (or one of its affiliates), as lessor (the "Lessor"), substantially in the proposed form presented to the Board at this meeting, and separate Schedules thereto substantially in the form attached to the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Board deems it for the benefit of the Town and for the efficient and effective administration thereof to enter into the Agreement and separate Schedules relating thereto from time to time as provided in the Agreement for the purchase, acquisition, financing and leasing of the Equipment to be therein described on the terms and conditions therein and herein provided;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the governing body of the Town as follows:

Section 1. Findings and Determinations. It is hereby found and determined that the terms of the Agreement (including the form of Schedule of Property and the form of Rental Payment Schedule, both attached thereto), in the form presented to the Town Council at this meeting, are in the best interests of the Town for the acquisition, purchase, financing and leasing of the Equipment.

Section 2. Approval of Documents. The form, terms and provisions of the Agreement (including the form of Schedule of Property and the form of Rental Payment Schedule, both attached thereto) are hereby approved in substantially the forms presented at this meeting, with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the Mayor and the Director of Finance of the Town (the "Authorized Officials") executing the same, the execution of such documents being conclusive evidence of such approval. The Authorized Officials are each hereby authorized and directed to sign and deliver on behalf of the Town the Agreement, each Schedule thereto under which a separate Lease (as defined in the Agreement) is created, each Rental Payment Schedule attached thereto and any related exhibits attached thereto if and when required; provided, however, that, without further authorization from the Town Council, (a) the aggregate principal component of Rental Payments under all Leases entered into pursuant to the Agreement shall not exceed \$4,625,000; (b) the maximum term under any Lease entered into pursuant to the Agreement shall not exceed eleven (11) years; and (c) the maximum interest rate used to

determine the interest component of Rental Payments under each Lease shall not exceed the lesser of the maximum rate permitted by law or three (3%) per annum. The Authorized Officials may sign and deliver Leases to the Lessor on behalf of the Town pursuant to the Agreement on such terms and conditions as they shall determine are in the best interests of the Town up to the maximum aggregate principal component, maximum term and maximum interest rate provided above. The foregoing authorization shall remain in effect for a period of two years from the date hereof during which the Authorized Officials are authorized to sign and deliver Leases pursuant to the Agreement on the terms and conditions herein provided and to be provided in each such Lease.

Section 3. Other Actions Authorized. The officers and employees of the Town shall take all action necessary or reasonably required by the parties to the Agreement to carry out, give effect to and consummate the transactions, contemplated thereby (including the execution and delivery of Final Acceptance Certificates, Escrow Agreements and any tax certificate and agreement, as contemplated in the Agreement) and to take all action necessary in conformity therewith, including, without limitation, the execution and delivery of any closing and other documents required to be delivered in connection with the Agreement and each Lease.

Section 4. No General Liability. Nothing contained in this Resolution, the Agreement, any Lease, any Escrow Agreement nor any other instrument shall be construed with respect to the Town as incurring a pecuniary liability or charge upon the general credit of the Town or against its taxing power, nor shall the breach of any agreement contained in this Resolution, the Agreement, any Lease, any Escrow Agreement or any other instrument or document executed in connection therewith impose any pecuniary liability upon the Town or any charge upon its general credit or against its taxing power, except to the extent that the Rental Payments payable under each Lease entered into pursuant to the Agreement are limited obligations of the Town, subject to annual appropriation, as provided in the Agreement.

Section 5. Appointment of Authorized Town Representatives. The Mayor and the Director of Finance of the Town are each hereby designated to act as authorized representatives of the Town for purposes of each Lease and the related Escrow Agreement until such time as the governing body of the Town shall designate any other or different authorized representative for purposes of the Agreement and any Lease or Escrow Agreement.

Section 6. Declaration of Official Intent. The Town hereby expresses its official intent pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Federal Income Tax Regulations, Title 26 (the "Regulations"), to reimburse expenditures paid sixty days prior to and anytime after the date of passage of this Resolution in the maximum amount of the Equipment with the proceeds of bonds, notes, tax-exempt leases, or other obligations ("Tax Exempt Obligations") authorized to be issued by the Town. The Tax Exempt Obligations shall be issued to reimburse such expenditures not later than 18 months after the later of the date of the expenditure or the substantial completion of the Equipment, or such later date the Regulations may authorize. The Town hereby certifies that the intention to reimburse as expressed herein is based upon its reasonable expectations as of this date. The Director of Finance or his designee is authorized to pay Equipment expenses in accordance herewith pending the issuance of the Tax Exempt Obligations.

Section 7. Severability. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

Section 8. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its approval and adoption.

The undersigned, a duly elected or appointed and acting Clerk of the Town Council of the Town
identified in the above Resolution No. (the "Resolution"), hereby certifies that the Resolution is a full,
true and correct copy of such Resolution as adopted by the governing body of the Town on January 5,
2016. The Resolution is in full force and effect on the date hereof and has not been amended, modified or
otherwise changed by the governing body of the Town since the date of adoption of the Resolution.

On Friday, December 11, 2015, the Town of East of Hartford opened competitive bids for the tax exempt lease/purchase of \$4.625 million of capital equipment and building improvements.

The town received four bids from a variety of capable companies with Banc of America Public Capital Corp. submitting the lowest bid of 2.025% allowing the Town to purchase the items.

The proceeds of the lease/purchase bid will allow the Town to purchase the following:

In support of the lease, I am attaching a 2014 letter from IBIC which compares the rates of bonds (2.120% to 2.298%) when the Town last completed a direct placement of debt. While leases are very different than bonds, the analysis is a good gauge to use to compare interest rates.

Additionally, also attached are two bond issues from December, 2015 to be used as a gauge against this lease transaction. The rates for those two bonds given the market ranges from 2.2186% to 2.2723%.

I have also attached a 2010 letter from Robinson and Cole related to a discussion at that time of the difference between leases and bonds. While that 2010 transaction was also very different than this transaction, the letter highlights that bonds are debt while leases have a non-appropriation clause which means they are subject to an annual appropriation and therefore they are not debt.

Leases also are secured by a collateral interest in the property that is leased which is different than bonds. Bonds also provide a pledge of the full faith and credit of the town while leases do not. Finally, while the issuance of bonds is subject to the referendum section of the Town Charter, leases are not.

The takeaway on this transaction is that by leasing rather than bonding, an attractive rate was secured saving the town approximately \$70,000 of interest over the term. Interest savings coupled with the savings in issuance costs of \$25,000 for the bond advisor, \$50,000 for the bond legal opinion, and \$10,000 to the rating agency allowed East Hartford to benefit in a material way with total savings estimated to be \$155,000.

I would respectfully ask that this correspondence be forwarded to the Town Council including the attached lease resolution as they consider the approval of this lease transaction.

I will be on hand at the January 5, 2016 meeting to address any question on the aforementioned.

All of the included transactions have a similar bond rating to the Town (Moody's – Aa2) and a similar structure. However, a 10 year issue with at least substantially level principal payments for a Aa2 issuer is not overly common so some of the transactions are spread over an eleven week period. I would like to point out that the security on Florida Board of Governor's was a revenue pledge rather than a general obligation (full faith and credit) pledge. Specifically, the payment on the bonds are secured by a first lien on the Capital Improvement Fees levied on every student enrolled in the university system. However, based on 1) the essential service nature of the issuer (State University System); 2) the strength of the pledged revenue; and 3) the underlying credit strength of the university system, the bonds traded like general obligation bonds, as evidenced by the reoffering yields received on the issue.

I would also like to call your attention to the transaction for the Londonderry School District. Londonderry School District is different than East Hartford in that the district does not have direct taxing authority over the property owners within the district and relives on assessments to the Town of Londonderry, NH. This is similar to the statutory framework that exists for Connecticut school districts. Additionally, New Hampshire state law allows school districts to maintain only minimal fund balance and only with voter approval. If approved, local school districts can retain up to 2.5% of their operating budget which can only be used in the case of an emergency or for future tax relief. Generally speaking, these factors would negatively impact a school district's bond rating and ultimately the marketability of its bonds. However, in the case of Londonderry School District, both the district and the Town of Londonderry are rated Aa2 by Moody's, which I believe speaks to the underlying credit strength of the Town of Londonderry. Due to the Town's credit strength, I included the district's transaction in the comparisons. Furthermore, Londonderry does have a concentration in its employment and tax base similar to but albeit smaller than East Hartford's. I would like also like to point out that of the six bids that the district received on its bonds, five were 3.00% or higher. I believe that to be a function of the three things: 1) lack of direct taxing authority for the district; 2) the frequency that the district issues debt (last bond sale was June 2008) and most importantly, 3) the bank qualification of the bonds. In looking at the reoffering yields received on the bonds, it appears that the winning bidder assumed a larger benefit for the bank qualification than the other bidders. The benefit of the bank qualification is demonstrated in the lower reoffering yields seen in the 2021 to 2024 maturities. The lower reoffering yields and ultimately the large spread between the winning and second place bids exemplify the dynamics of the capital markets. On any given day, one investor may be more willing to put their capital at risk than other investors.

Finally, I would like to mention that by undertaking a direct placement with TD Bank, the Town saved approximately \$28,000 in issuance costs.

Dear Mr. Walsh:

You have asked whether the Equipment Lease/Purchase Agreement (Taxable Direct Pay Qualified Energy Conservation Bond), dated as of June 1, 2010 (the "Taxable QECB Agreement"), by and between the Town of East Hartford, Connecticut (the "Town" or the "Lessee") and Banc of America Leasing & Capital, LLC ("Lessor"), and the Equipment Lease/Purchase Agreement (Tax-Exempt Lease), dated as of June 1, 2010 (the "Tax-Exempt Agreement" and together with the Taxable QECB Agreement, the "Agreements"), by and between the Town and Lessor are subject to Section 6.10 of the Town's Charter requiring a referendum for the issuance of bonds and notes. Capitalized terms used but not otherwise defined herein shall have the meanings ascribed to such terms in the Agreements.

Section 3.02 of the Agreements provide that:

Lessee intends, subject to Section 3.03, to continue the Lease Term through the Original Term and all Renewal Terms. Lessee affirms that sufficient funds are available for the next fiscal year to make the first Rental Payment scheduled to be paid hereunder, and Lessee reasonably believes that an amount sufficient to make all Rental Payments during the entire Lease Term can be obtained from legally available funds of Lessee. Lessee further intends to do all things lawfully within its power to obtain and maintain funds sufficient and available to discharge its obligation to make Rental Payments due hereunder, including making provision for such payments to the extent necessary in each budget or appropriation request submitted and adopted in accordance with applicable provisions of law, to have such portion of the budget or appropriation request approved and to exhaust all available reviews and appeals in the event such portion of the budget or appropriation request is not approved.

Section 3.03 of the Agreements provide that "Lessee is obligated only to pay such Rental Payments as may lawfully be made from funds budgeted and appropriated for that purpose during Lessee's then current fiscal year." Section 4.03 of the Agreements provide "Lessor and Lessee understand and intend that the obligation of Lessee to pay Rental Payments shall constitute a current expense of Lessee payable solely from its funds that are legally

available for that purpose, including, but not limited to, its general fund, and shall not in any way be construed to be a bond, note or other debt of Lessee in contravention of any applicable constitutional or statutory limitation or requirement concerning the creation of indebtedness by Lessee, nor shall anything contained herein constitute a pledge of the full faith and credit, general tax revenues, funds or moneys of Lessee."

Section 3.03 of the Agreements further provide:

Should Lessee fail to budget, appropriate or otherwise make available funds to pay Rental Payments following the then current Original Term or Renewal Term or pay rental payments arising under the Tax-Exempt Lease, this Agreement shall be deemed terminated at the end of the then current Original Term or Renewal Term and the Tax-Exempt Lease shall also be deemed terminated at the end of its then current term. Lessee agrees to deliver notice to Lessor of such terminations promptly after any decision to non-appropriate is made, but failure to give such notice shall not extend the term of this Agreement beyond such Original Term or Renewal Term or the term of the Tax-Exempt Lease beyond its then current term. If this Agreement is terminated in accordance with this Section, Lessee agrees to cease use of the Equipment and peaceably deliver at Lessee's cost, the Equipment to Lessor at the location(s) to be specified by Lessor.

Section 6.01 of the Agreements further provide that "[u]pon the occurrence of an Event of Default hereunder or under the Tax-Exempt Lease or upon termination of this Agreement pursuant to Section 3.03 hereof or termination of the Tax-Exempt Lease pursuant to Section 3.03 thereof, full and unencumbered legal title to the Equipment shall pass to Lessor, and Lessee shall have no further interest therein."

Based on the foregoing, we are of the opinion that the Agreements do not constitute a bond or a note of the Town subject to referendum under Section 6.10 of the Town's Charter.

We express no opinion herein as to any laws other than the laws of the State of Connecticut and the federal laws of the United States.

This opinion is solely as of the date hereof, and we have no obligation to advise you with respect to matters hereafter arising. You may rely on this opinion in connection with the execution and delivery of the Agreements. This opinion may not be relied upon by any other person or entity, nor may copies be delivered or furnished to any other person or entity, nor may all or portions of this opinion be quoted, circulated or referred to in any other document without the prior written consent of a partner of this firm.

Request for bid waiver for Fire Apparatus Repair

In accordance with Section 10-7 (c) of the Town of East Hartford Code of Ordinances, I request a bid waiver to conduct a fire apparatus repair that exceeds \$10,000.

A recent inspection of Ladder 2 (the ladder truck that serves the south end of the community) found significant corrosion damage. The department asked the manufacturer's representative (Fleetmasters) to develop an estimate to conduct the repair. That estimate was over \$80,000 and lead us to engage other vendors. We reached out to Gowan's & Knight (located in Watertown, CT) and Minuteman Fire Apparatus (Massachusetts) and both declined the opportunity to quote the work due to the proprietary nature of some of the parts. This appeared to be a common theme as we approached other apparatus repair facilities.

We asked Fleetmasters to re-evaluate their estimate and include only those critical items that will ensure serviceability of the apparatus and insure the apparatus will pass its upcoming certification test. The current estimate is \$41,134. Despite being a lesser amount, it still exceeds the permissible threshold.

Use of Fleetmasters to conduct this work, enables the following:

- Ensures the repair will be accomplished using parts from the original manufacturer
- Ensures the apparatus will pass its certification testing in early 2016
- Ensures the apparatus repair will be conducted by personnel familiar with this type of apparatus.

I have attached the scope of work quoted by Fleetmasters. Funds for this work will be developed through a series of transfers from other department accounts.
