Attached is a draft resolution authorizing your signature of documents related to the Town's receipt of "Click It or Ticket" grant funds from the state Department of Transportation (DOT).

The East Hartford Police Department intends to participate once again in the statewide mobilization of the "Click It or Ticket" program. The Click It or Ticket enforcement campaign is a key tool in public awareness and enforcement for safety belt use. The amount of 2015 funding has yet to be determined, but last year the Town received \$9,000 from this program. I have attached a 2014 fact sheet that explains the program in more detail.

Funding for the "Click It or Ticket" program works on a reimbursement format. The Police Department is required to submit a Certifications and Assurances form to the state DOT in order to receive reimbursement. The resolution will authorize you to sign this form.



- Enforce day <u>and night</u> Statistics show nighttime drivers are less likely to buckle up compared to daytime drivers. 10,480 passenger vehicle occupants were killed in motor vehicle traffic crashes at night (6 p.m. to 5:59 a.m.) in 2012. Of those killed in nighttime crashes, 55 percent were not wearing seat belts (compared to 41 percent of occupants killed during daytime hours of 6 a.m. to 5:59 p.m.).

- Teens and young adults are at higher risk Among young adult passenger vehicle
 occupants ages 18 to 34, who were killed in crashes, 56 percent were not buckled up—the

Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Update

Updating the boundaries and functions of the new Metropolitan Planning Organization is a multi-faceted, multi-step process. CRCOG's goal is to smoothly transition all CRCOG members into the CRCOG MPO.

The steps are:

- Towns and cities currently in an MPO (Plainville, New Britain, Southington and Berlin) must have their MPO vote and indicate what MPOs the towns would join. This was accomplished at the CCRPA meeting on October 14th.
- Towns and cities joining the CRCOG MPO who were previously not in an MPO (Stafford, Willington, Coventry, Mansfield and Columbia) must pass a resolution to join the MPO. Currently, CRCOG has received resolutions from Mansfield, Coventry and Columbia.
- A majority of CRCOG Towns, including the largest municipality and a representation of 75% of the total population must pass a resolution to accept the new towns into the CRCOG MPO.
- Once the CRCOG MPO acceptance resolutions have been passed, the Governor must approve the change in the MPO and this completes the redesignation process.

CRCOG staff recommends that CRCOG towns begin the process to pass the acceptance resolutions in each of the towns. A model resolution has been provided and CRCOG staff recommends using the current wording in the resolution where possible, as this resolution has been approved by the Connecticut Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration.


