Resolution Approving the Proposed Special Revenue Program and Budget for the Fiscal Year 2020-2021

BE IT, THEREFORE, RESOLVED:

That the East Hartford Town Council does hereby approve the Mayor's recommendation for the Special Revenue Programs to be conducted during the fiscal year 2020-2021 on a self-supporting basis, and further requires that any new programs to be offered under Special Programs Fund must first be approved by the Town Council. The Council further requires that any excess funds accruing in this account at the end of each fiscal year, as determined by the independent auditors, shall be transferred to the General Fund as revenue in the next succeeding fiscal year.

Adoption of the Town of East Hartford's 5-Year Capital Improvement Plan

to adopt the Town of East Hartford's 5-Year Capital Improvement Plan for fiscal years 2020-2021 through 2024-2025 as contained in the Mayor's Recommended Budget for fiscal year 2020-2021 with the following amendments: (1) the lease payments for the 2020-2021 Rolling Stock purchases shall be five years and are anticipated to be as set out in the attached chart entitled "Schedule of Leases Payable for FY Ending June 30, 2021"; and (2) the funds used for the purchase of real time crime center technology will not use artificial intelligence or facial recognition. The technology will not be monitored except when a potentially criminal incident occurs or during an active criminal investigation. Motion carried 9/0.

<u>Chair Kehoe</u> recognized the Mayor and her Directors for their hard work with this budget. Additionally, he thanked East Hartford's legislative delegation for their diligence in obtaining funds at the state level for the Board of Education as well as the town.

<u>Mayor Leclerc</u> thanked her Directors – noting new Finance Director Linda Trzetziak's efforts during the past few weeks – the town's Legislative delegation, and the Town Council for supporting her budget. Also, the Mayor stated to the new Councillors that now they understand what the budget process entails.
