# **NEW BUSINESS**

## Tax Lien Sales

Finance Director Mike Walsh initiated a general discussion regarding the possibility of the state taking action regarding tax lien sales which could possibly make it more difficult to sell and collect on tax lien sales and may require the Town to use a tax sale format in the future.

Director Walsh also pointed out that the tax lien list from January 13, 2016 of \$902,463 has increased to now total \$1,046,000. He seeks to send the tax lien list to the full Town Council for approval using the same format followed by the Town and outlined in the motion coming out of this Committee.

Director Walsh is also looking to take the new 2014 Grand List and match the subsequent liens with prior buyers of liens on the same property per the terms of the RFP for prior tax lien sales.

#### MOTION

to **authorize** the administration to conduct a tax lien sale by way of a request for proposal (RFP) and to seek and receive sealed bids pursuant to an invitation to bid on a number of tax liens held by the town on specific real property as listed on lists 1 and 2 as produced by Finance Director Mike Walsh and attached to a memorandum dated January 13, 2016 from Mayor Marcia Leclerc to Town Council Chair Richard Kehoe, subject to the following four conditions:

- 1. The Collector of Revenue shall notify the record owner of each property subject to a lien that is to be included in the tax lien sale, by certified mail, that the lien is being included in the request for proposal and invitation to bid, and that the owner should contact the Town immediately to pay the taxes or seek a payment plan if they wish to keep the Town's tax liens on their property from being sold;
- 2. In order to qualify for a payment plan, the property owner must meet the following three criteria:
  - They must remit 25% of the outstanding amount due
  - They cannot have defaulted on a prior payment arrangement
  - Their property must not have active property code violations;
- 3. The letters from the Collector of Revenue to each property owner shall notify the property owner that the purchaser of the tax lien on their property shall have the right to foreclose on that property; and
- 4. The Administration shall return to the Town Council with the results of the request for proposal and that the proposal for each tax lien must be approved by the Town Council before it is sold.

And further to **authorize** the Administration to assign the subsequent tax liens as listed on the attached totaling \$561,151.43 to the vendors who currently hold the prior year tax liens on these properties
