OPPORTUNITY FOR RESIDENTS TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL ON AGENDA ITEMS

<u>Susan Kniep</u>, 44-46 and 50 Olde Roberts Street, spoke to (1) the state budget's impact on the town; (2) use of the CDBG money for housing rehabilitation; (3) believes that – due to the poor economic climate – the town should hold off on any proposed bonding.

Mayor Leclerc (1) addressed the use of the CDBG monies; (2) the bonds on tonight's agenda are for discussion purposes only; (3) the EHPD will host their awards ceremony on June 2nd; (4) the annual "Fallen Officer" ceremony will be held May 18th; (5) Raymond Library will have children's programs that tie into Public Works week; (6) the EHPD's Click It or Ticket program will begin May 23rd; (7) the town's low-cost rabies clinic will be held Saturday May 21st;(8) every Saturday in May, the town's transfer station will be open; and (9) the new Dunkin Donuts on the corner of Walnut and Burnside will open Saturday May 21st.

The Council will consider each item at the July meeting and determine which items to move forward to a public hearing in August.

Mayor Update: State Budget Impact On Town

<u>Mayor Leclerc</u> and <u>Mike Walsh</u>, Finance Director, discussed the \$1.5M shortfall for fiscal year 2016-2017 that is created by the reduction in 2016-2017 state assistance to towns. The Mayor has implemented a town-wide budget freeze and has asked that all town departments find ways to cut spending and overtime.

2016-2017 Neighborhood Assistance act Program

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing to present these applications was held on April 27, 2016, as required by the State of Connecticut.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED: That Marcia A. Leclerc, Mayor of the Town of East Hartford, is authorized to forward these applications to the State of Connecticut Department of Revenue Services for their review and inclusion into the 2016 Neighborhood Assistance Act Tax Credit Program.

WHEREAS, receipt of this entitlement grant is contingent upon the submission of a Forty-second Program Year Action Plan, and Certifications of Compliance; and

WHEREAS, citizen input was obtained, in accordance with the Grants Administration Office's Citizen Participation Plan, at three Public Hearings held on November 9, 2015 and March 14, 2016.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of East Hartford recognizes the need for funding the objectives contained in the Forty-second Program Year Action Plan and endorses this Plan as reflecting the Town's Community Development needs.

AND, FURTHER, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council does support and authorize the submission of the Forty-second Program Year Action Plan, and Grantee Certifications to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and authorizes its Mayor, Marcia A. Leclerc, to act as representative of the Town and to enter into contract and any amendments thereof with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.
