Chair Kehoe called the public hearing to order at 7:06 p.m. The Chair announced the exit locations in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes §29-381, after which the Council joined him in the pledge of allegiance.

The Town Council of the Town of East Hartford will meet in the Council Chambers on **Tuesday, August 4, 2015 at 7:00 p.m.** for the purpose of holding a public hearing on the following proposed bond resolutions:

RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING \$4,625,000 FOR THE PLANNING, DESIGN, ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND EQUIPMENT AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,625,000 BONDS OF THE TOWN TO MEET SAID APPROPRIATION AND PENDING THE ISSUANCE THEREOF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY BORROWINGS FOR SUCH PURPOSE;

**AND** 

RESOLUTION APPROPRIATING \$5,000,000 FOR THE PLANNING, DESIGN, ACQUISITION AND CONSTRUCTION AND/OR RENOVATION OF A SENIOR CENTER/MULTIPURPOSE FACILITY AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$5,000,000 BONDS OF THE TOWN TO MEET SAID APPROPRIATION AND PENDING THE ISSUANCE THEREOF THE MAKING OF TEMPORARY BORROWINGS FOR SUCH PURPOSE.

Copies of said resolutions are on file and open to public inspection at the office of the Town Clerk and the Town Council.

Chair Kehoe summarized the legal process for the proposed bonds and offered background information on each.

The following citizens came forward in favor of a new senior center:

<u>Linda Larensen</u>, 20 Brandon Road; <u>Lydia Ciccarello</u>, 46 Strong Drive; <u>Marie Frederickson</u>, Elms Village Drive; <u>Amy Peart</u>, 74 Wood Drive; <u>Bonnie Kishimoto</u>, 22 Matthew Road; <u>Maureen Sundin</u>, 6 Suffolk Drive; <u>Pam Fasciglione</u>; and <u>Nancy Yiznitsky</u>, 87 Montclair Drive.

<u>Laura Sobolewski</u>, Aquatics Director, Parks and Recreation Department, is greatly in favor of a new senior center since it will be considered a multi-purpose facility.

<u>Kathy Kane</u>, Senior Services Coordinator, presented the Council with six pages of names of citizens who could not attend this public hearing but are in favor of a new senior center.

<u>Steven Strange</u>, 40 Maplewood Avenue, raised questions regarding tax breaks for senior citizens, referendums for property assessments and tax increases, the restricted use of the senior center and the cost of a new senior center versus a renovated senior center.

<u>Sue Simmons</u>, 19 Vincent Court and <u>Patti Rakauskas</u>, 10 Palmer Drive, are concerned about their property assessment and tax mill rate.

Reginald Thibault, 42 Chester Street, is not in favor of bonding for a senior center.

<u>Susan Kniep</u>, 50 Olde Roberts Street, asked for clarification on whether the proposed senior center bond is for a newly constructed building or a renovated building. Ms. Kniep also suggested that a recently approved State of Connecticut grant for \$900,000 and a cash contribution from the Friends of the Senior Center of \$300,000 be utilized to up-grade the existing senior center housed in the former McCartin School.

<u>Don Sugalski</u>, 1736 Main Street, is concerned about bonding for the construction of a new senior center versus renovating the existing structure using the State of Connecticut grant for \$900,000 and money from the Friends of the Senior Center of \$300,000.
