## OPPORTUNITY FOR COUNCILLORS TO DIRECT QUESTIONS TO THE ADMINISTRATION

Esther Clarke said she read a recent newspaper article on the possibility of a development at the Showcase Cinemas property and asked if there was more information that the Mayor could share with the Council. Mayor Leclerc said that project is in the early stages of due diligence and that the Town's real estate consultant is working with the developer to get more finite details. Once those details become available and the project begins to develop, she will update the Council.

#### OPPORTUNITY FOR RESIDENTS TO SPEAK

Mayor Leclerc commented on the following: (1) in observance of Labor Day, the transfer station will be closed on Saturday, September 5th and the collection of municipal waste and recycling, ordinarily scheduled for Monday, will be moved forward one day; (2) the staff at the Public Works Department continue their efforts on clean-up from Tropical Storm Isaias; (3) Linda Trzetziak, Finance Director and Kim Cummings, Assistant Finance Director have been working diligently with representatives from FEMA regarding COVID funds and the reimbursement of expenses for Tropical Storm Isaias; (4) the Senior Center project is on time and on budget; (5) Governor Lamont has extended the State of Emergency for Connecticut until February 9, 2021; (6) since there is a slight up-tick in the number of COVID positive cases, it is important for the public to maintain COVID awareness by maintaining social distancing, wearing face masks, not having large gathering, etc.; (7) the East Hartford Public Library will have an extremely limited reopening of the library; (8) Town Hall remains closed but will be accessible by appointment only to the public; (9) the Mayor recognized Ken Sayers, I.T. Manager and Jessica Carrero, Mayor's Assistant for their hard work preparing on-line forms and the remote log-in to assist in the reopening of Town Hall; (10) the Renters Rebate deadline is October 1st via telephone; (11) one of the last underground oil tanks is being removed from the Town Hall parking lot; (12) there will be another grant coming from the Secretary of the State's office to help defray the additional cost of processing the absentee ballots in the November election; and (13) the 2020 Census is coming to a close at the end of September, but it is still very important for all residents be counted.
